Rupert Bear is 100 Years Old



There was an air raid on the Eastern and North-Eastern Counties last evening; and some of the raiders penetrated some way inland.

In all they numbered six or seven, and were over the Eastern districts for several hours.

Comparatively little damage was done, and, for the most part, the enemy's airmen did not seem to know where they were.

In one town ten or twelve bombs were dropped, only one of which caused loss of life or damaged

An incendiary bomb was dropped on a small house on the outskirts of the town and crashed into a bedroom, killing the mother and seriously injuring two children, one of whom died during the night.

The total casualties reported in the raided reas up to noon were 27 killed and 53 injured.
